The [region](#)^[1] of South West England is divided into 58 parliamentary constituencies, which are made up of 16 [borough constituencies](#) and 42 [county constituencies](#). Since the general election of July 2024, 24 are represented by [Labour](#) MPs, 22 by [Liberal Democrat](#) MPs, 11 by [Conservative](#) MPs, and 1 by a [Green](#) MP.

2023 boundary changes

Following the abandonment of the Sixth Periodic Review (the 2018 review), the Boundary Commission for England formally launched the 2023 Review on 5 January 2021. The Commission calculated that the number of seats to be allocated to the South West region would be increased by 3, from 55 to 58.^[4] Initial proposals were published on 8 June 2021 and, following two periods of public consultation, revised proposals were published on 8 November 2022. The final proposals were published on 28 June 2023.

Under the proposals, the following constituencies for the region came into effect at the 2024 general election:^[5]

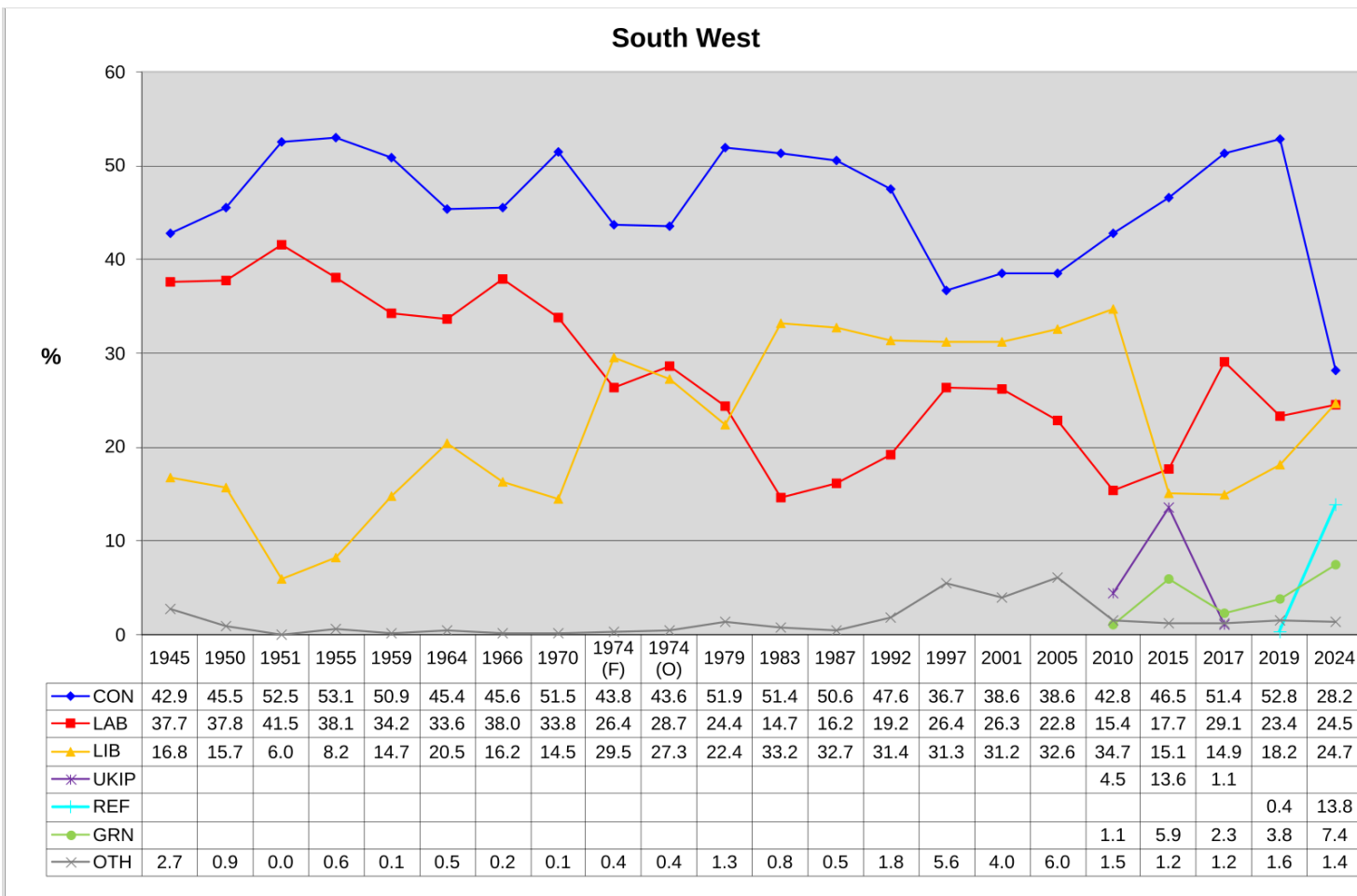

Percentage votes

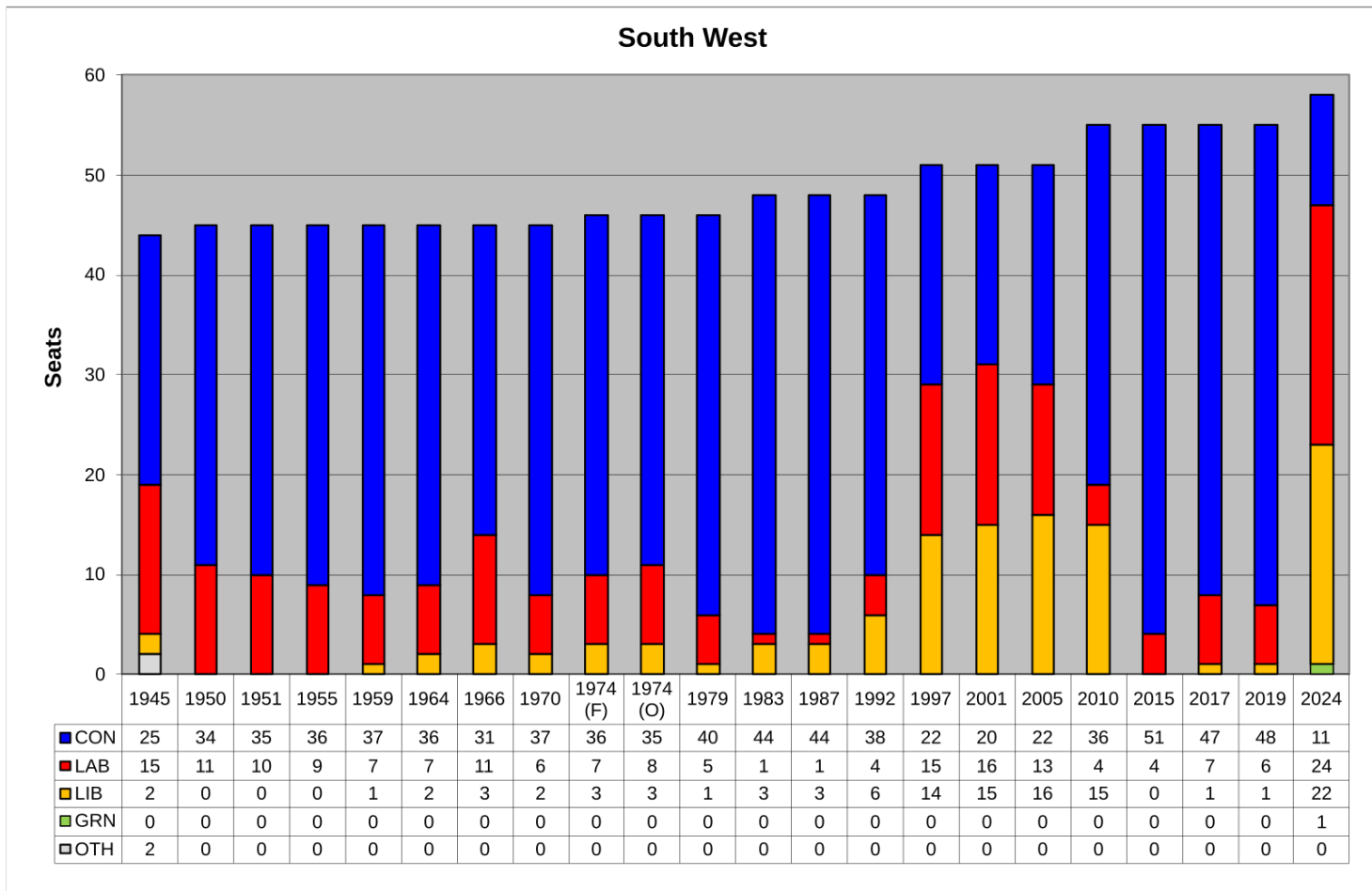


South West votes %
